
Sign up to SOS Children's Keepy Uppy Challenge and put your football skills to the test during **Keepy Uppy Week**, **14-20 May**.

The Challenge

- Every child between the ages of 5-16 has the chance to enter either individually or as part of a team
- £2 'pay to play' entrance fee, sponsorship is also encouraged
- Prizes for the primary and secondary school or club with the longest 'keepy uppy' time

Keepy Uppy Guidelines

There are a number of different ways schools can take part in the Keepy Uppy challenge according to ability:

a) Individual knock-out competition
On the blast of the organiser's
whistle and start of the stopwatch, all
participants begin juggling their ball
using any part of their body (except
hands and arms) to keep the ball off
the floor for as long as possible*. If a
participant loses control of their ball,
they sit down. The last person left
juggling is the winner. The organiser
stops the clock when the last person
stops or loses control.

b) Individual timed competition

Each competitor is individually timed to see how long they can juggle the ball. Schools might wish to have daily keepy uppy sessions, keeping tabs on progress through the week and finding an overall winner on the Friday.

c) Team competition

In teams of three, pupils juggle the ball for a maximum of three kicks before passing to a team mate. Passes must be made in order. Each team may have 5 attempts, with their best score being registered.

*To enable younger and less able competitors to equally enjoy the event, organisers may wish to allow one bounce between each touch of the ball.

Why Angola?

This summer, we'll be distributing footballs in Angola, an African country that has suffered from many years of war and poverty. But giving out footballs doesn't just mean that kids can enjoy their childhood. We give the balls to the African schools for safe keeping, which also means we're encouraging children to attend classes and complete their education, helping to make sure they have the skills and knowledge they need to lead independent lives.

Fundraise for a great cause!


All the money from the Keepy Uppy Campaign will support the Great Angolan Football Giveaway, so the more money you raise, the more children we can help.
